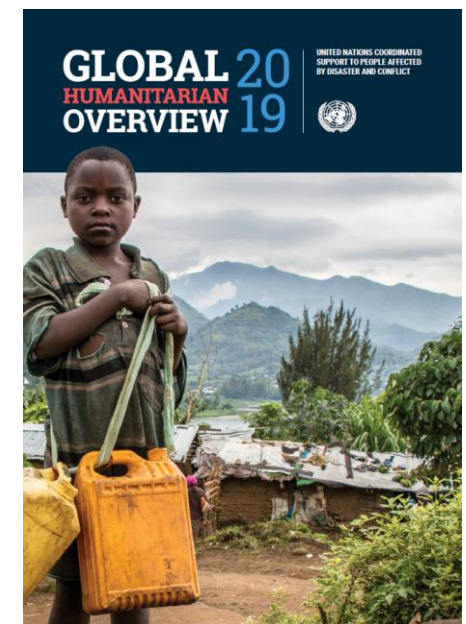
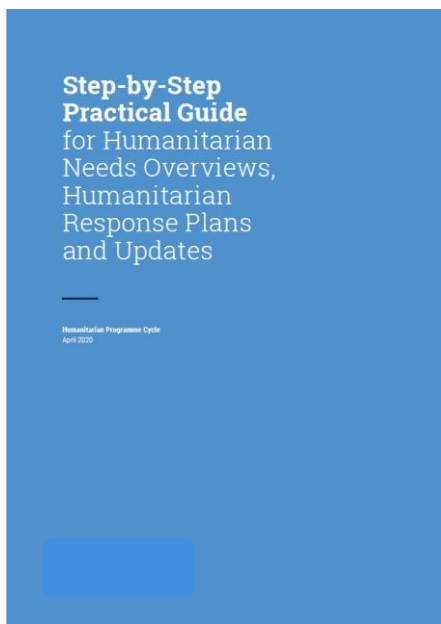

WHAT THE REVISION AIMS TO ACHIEVE

- **Improve the relevance and effectiveness of humanitarian response**
- **Increase quality and usefulness of needs analysis to inform decision-making**
- **Enable more meaningful monitoring of needs and results**
- **Reflect WHS & Grand Bargain Commitments**
 - Inter-sectoral and comprehensive analysis of needs
 - Risk and vulnerability analysis
 - People-centred analysis
 - Integration of affected people's voice and own priorities
 - Localization of response
 - Inter-sectoral analysis of response options
 - Prioritisation of response based on intended humanitarian outcomes
 - Systematic consideration of options for cash transfer programming and other response modalities
 - Humanitarian-Development Nexus

WHAT IS NEW FOR HPC 2020

- Stronger linkages between the HNO and the HRP
- Increased focus on the **intersectoral nature of needs and the response** required
- Better the understanding of **causes**, level of **severity**, and likely **evolution of needs** for a more holistic and effective response with linkages to development interventions
- Identifying **priority groups and/or geographic areas** based on the needs analysis, and formulating **results-based strategic objectives** that define desired changes in the lives of people and inform multi-sectoral and sectoral planning
- Establishing or augmenting **monitoring systems** that allow for on-going analysis of changes of the situation and needs together with response achievements

WHAT IS NEW FOR HPC 2020

- **Prioritizing inclusivity** through disaggregation and/or analysis of the differential impacts of the crisis and associated needs for diverse groups of people, and **communicating with communities**
- Forward-looking **risk analysis, projections and anticipatory action**

WHAT WE ARE SEEKING FOR GH0 2020



- Strengthened quality of analysis to better inform decisions on funding allocations
- Stronger narrative around outcome-level results and impact of humanitarian action in 2019
- Strengthened focus on achievements and improvements within the humanitarian system
