HIGHLIGHTS

Improving Health Access and Scaling up Responsiveness:

2,244 normal deliveries were attended by skilled birth attendants.

In February 139,373 outpatient consultations were conducted to treat different illness.

Prevent, detect and respond to epidemic prone disease outbreaks:

In February 2020 around 73% epidemic prone disease alerts were verified and responded to within 48 hours.

A total of 1,363 children (6 months to 15 years) were vaccinated against measles.

Quality Essential Clinical Health Services

In February 23 new Severe Acute Malnutrition (SAM) children with complications were treated in stabilization centres.

In February, 13 health facilities are reported providing sexual and gender based violence (SGBV) services and 65 SGBV survivors received clinical management of rape (CMR) services.

Improving Resilience- Mental Health Response:

5,438 beneficiaries received Mental Health and Psychosocial Support (MPHSS) in conflict affected areas.

There were 40 health facilities reported providing MPHSS services in vulnerability settings.

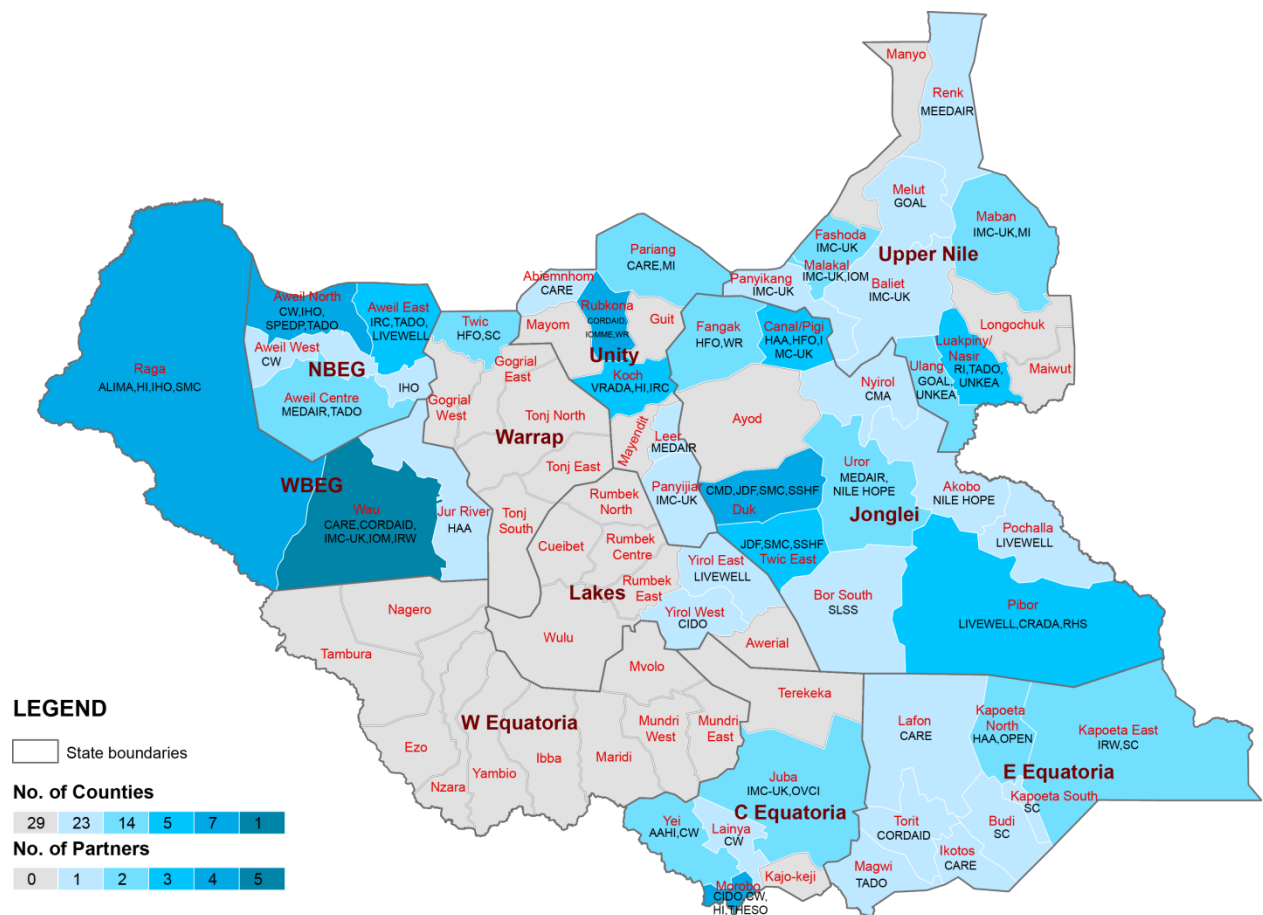

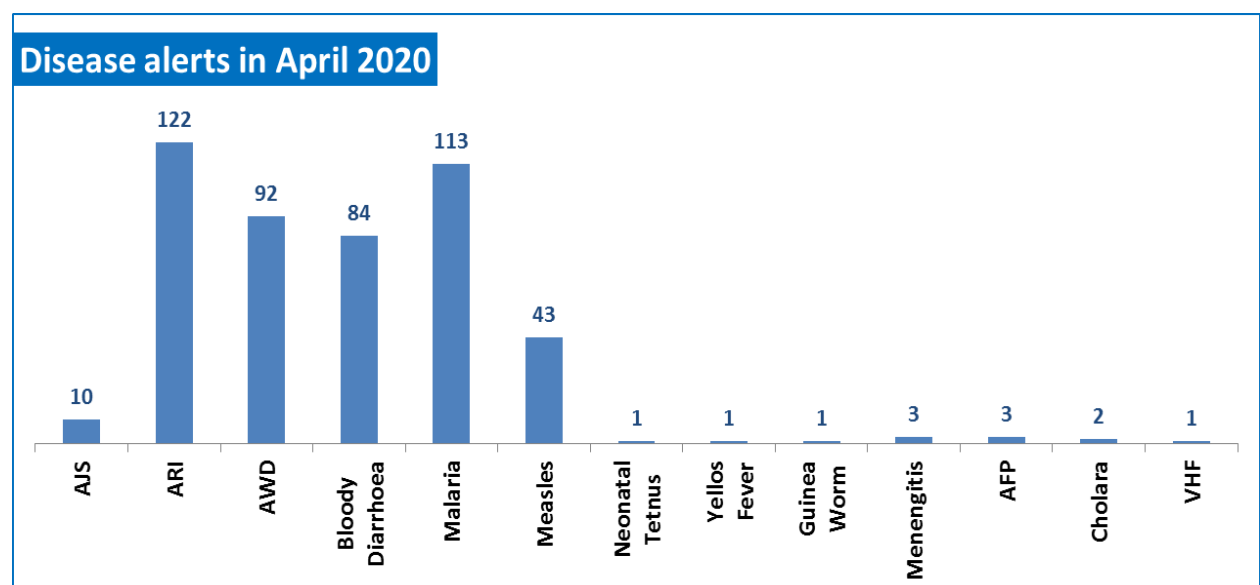

Operational Presence of Partners

- According to 5W data submitted during January till April 2020, 37 HRP partners reported data at least once.
- During the year 2020 health cluster HRP partners covered 50 counties out of 79. There were 23 counties with single partner, 14 counties with 2 partners, 5 counties with 3 partners, 7 counties with 4 partners and 1 county with 5 partners present.

KEY CONTEXT UPDATE



Public Health Risks and Key Gaps

- Averagely 73% alerts were verified and responded back by week. ARI, AWE, bloody diarrhoea, Malaria and measles remain the top disease for alerts in April 2020.
- There were 10 AJS alerts received in April. 1 alert was undergoing verification and 1 been responded to.
- 35 ARI cases undergoing verification while 2 been monitored.
- There were 92 AWD alerts received from all over the states except Jonglie and Lakes states.
- There were 113 confirmed Malaria cases in WES, WBGZ, Warrap, Upper Nile, Utiy and CES states.
- Hepatitis E outbreak was reported on 3rd January 2018 in Bentiu PoC. Total cases reported so far are 276 with the attack rate of 0.39. There were 11 cases confirmed since last week.

MEASLES OUTBREAK

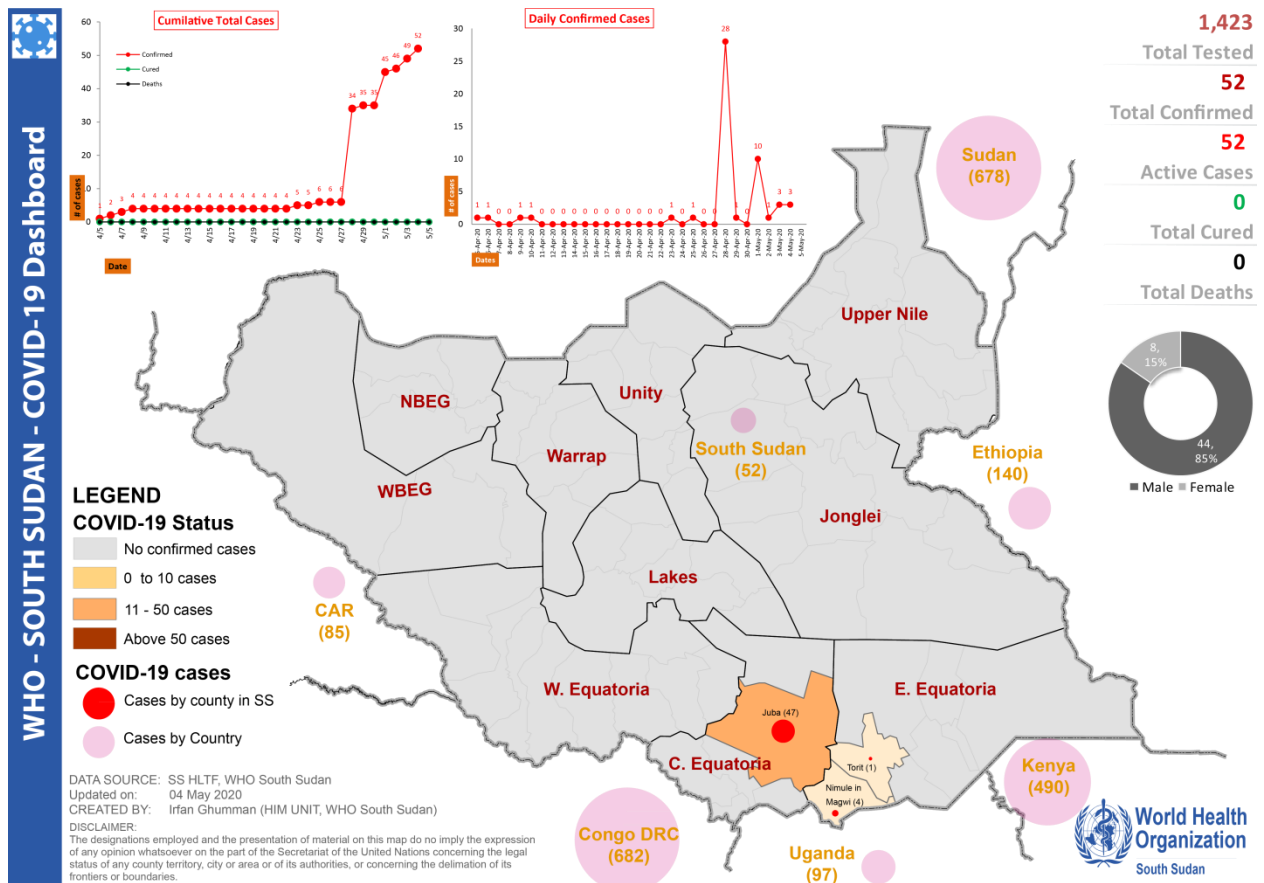
- In 2020 measles outbreak was confirmed in Tonj East, Magwi, Bor, Kapoeta East and Tonj North.
- Measles outbreak was also erupted in Bentiu PoC on 24th April 2019. 440 measles cases were reported since then with the attack rate of 0.11.
- Measles was also erupted in Aweil East County on 29th December 2019 and by now cumulative case are 316 with the attack rate of .053. 17 measles cases are confirmed since last one week.
- Case management, vaccination and health promotion interventions were conducted.

South Sudan Situation update (as of 4th May, 2020)

On 5th April 1st COVID-19 case was identified in Juba. Since then there were 1,423 tests performed out of which 52 cases clinically confirmed COVID-19 positive. There was no death recorded so far.

- 47 cases were confirmed in Juba, 4 in Magwi (Nimule) and 1 case in Torit County.
- Active surveillance is on-going to determine if there is active transmission in Juba and surrounding areas.
- The ILI/SARI sentinel sites have been expanded from 20 to 45 in Juba.
- Implementation of priorities, risk communication, active case search and testing, quarantine for contacts, infection prevention and control and management of cases are currently underway.
- The overall response currently led by the COVID-19 high level taskforce and the COVID-19 steering committee.

PARTNER IMPLEMENTATION KEY HIGHLIGHTS

Healthcare Foundation Organization (HFO)

Canal/Pigi and Twic Counties

- HFO run 1 PHCU and 1 Mobile clinic using SSHF funding.
- During the month of 1,628 beneficiaries were attended in Ayien Amoul and Diel Mobile clinic.
- There were 197 Mother were given ANC services as well.
- 458 children aged from 6-59 months and 211 PLWs



were screened through MUAC in both facilities.

Fangak County

- In Fangak county HFO run 5 health facilities (Juaibor PHCC, Keew PHCC, Pulite PHCU, Paguir PHCU and Kuerpon PHCU) using World Bank funding.
- 4,099 beneficiaries were treated for common illness through OPD consultations un
- 265 mothers were also given ANC services in these health facilities.
- EPI 248 children vaccinated and 221 mothers immunized with TT.
- 1,184 children aged 6-59 months and 416 PLWs were screened through MUAC.
- 12 community meetings were also conducted for Fangak, Canal/Pigi and Twic county 2 per each county. Each meeting contains 64 community members of different group i.e. Women, Chiefs, CHD's and ROSS secretaries.
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
